

Kidney Cancer



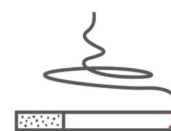
10th most commonly diagnosed cancer in Australia.

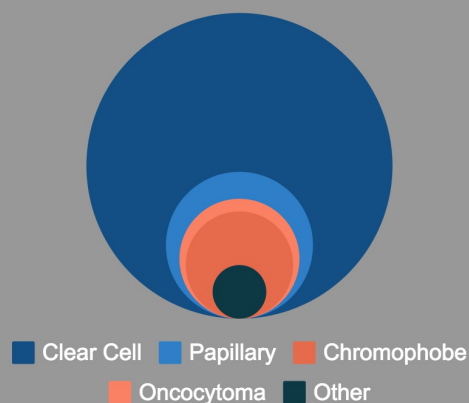

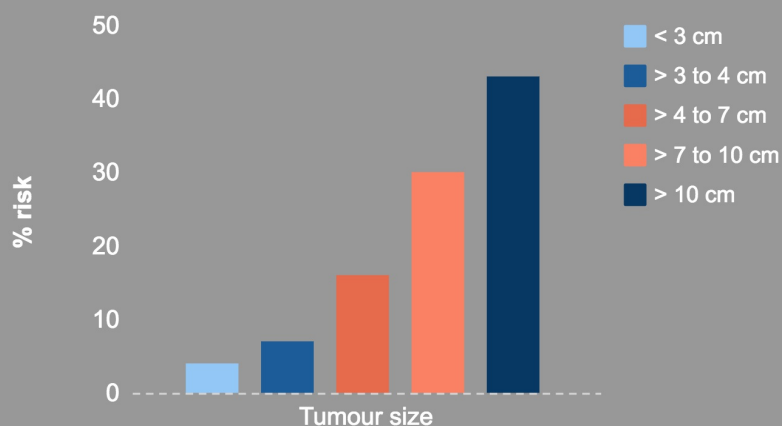

Risk of spread to other organs

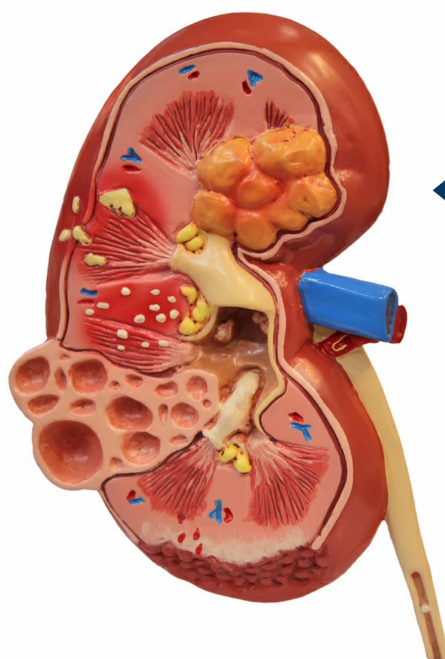


Radical Nephrectomy

Removal of the entire kidney

For larger, more invasive tumours

Can increase the risk of long term kidney dysfunction



Partial Nephrectomy

Removal of only the part of the kidney that contains cancer

Ideal for smaller, localised tumours

Reduced risk of kidney failure and its complications
